[Committee on Government Reform, 11/03] Democrats would provide *security* by maintaining a strong military, sound diplomatic alliances, and by keeping our promises to those who have served.

**Security – Defending the Homeland.** The Republican budget slashes funding for the COPS program, which has put 137 cops on the street in Wyoming, by 96 percent. [DOJ, 10/19/04; Budget of the US Government, 2/05] It cuts \$9,050,000 from homeland security formula grants in Wyoming, which provide police, firefighters and emergency management teams with the training and equipment they need to keep communities safe. It also cuts \$828,000 from the Centers on Disease Control's state and local capacity bioterrorism grants, which fund needed improvements in public health and medical infrastructure statewide. [FFIS, 2/05] Democrats would provide *security* with new resources for our first responders and tighter security at our ports and borders.

**Fairness.** Five million people have lost their health insurance over the past four years, including 2,000 in Wyoming, but the Republican budget eliminates the \$83 million Healthy Communities Access Program and includes a proposal to expand high deductible insurance plans that would actually increase the number of people without insurance by 350,000. [CPS, 9/04; CBPP 2/10/04] Democrats would ensure *fairness* by lowering the cost of health care, ensuring equal opportunity for all, and eliminating tax loopholes so everyone pays their fair share.

**Opportunity.** Republicans have underfunded No Child Left Behind by \$39 billion over the past four years nationwide. Under the Republican budget, 7,959 children in Wyoming will go without promised help in reading and math and 8,812 will no longer be able to enroll in the after-school programs that boost academic achievement and keep kids safe. [CRS, 2/05] Pell Grants serve 8,129 students in Wyoming, but the budget fails to provide the promised \$1,000 increase in Pell Grant levels. [Federal Pell Grant End of Year Report, 2003-2004] Democrats will increase *opportunity* through high quality early childhood education, vibrant and accountable public schools, and an affordable college education.

**Community.** The budget cuts \$8,053,000 in funding for housing, employment counseling, transitional assistance, and small business loans and cuts LIHEAP funding by \$240,000 in Wyoming. In addition, the Bush budget slashes funding for the states' Clean Water revolving loan funds, which help improve wastewater treatment facilities, by \$1,768,000 in Wyoming. [FFIS, 2/05] Democrats would support our *communities* by expanding affordable housing, lowering energy costs for seniors, and making polluters pay for the damage they cause.

**Accountability.** The Republicans' reckless disregard for fiscal responsibility has led to a deficit of more than \$400 billion, creating a debt tax of \$2,400 for every family in Wyoming this year alone. [House Budget Committee Democratic Staff, 2/05] During the President's first term, each family in Wyoming saw their share of the national debt increase by \$34,525. [CTJ 9/04] Democrats will demand *accountability* by restoring fiscal responsibility, holding those in power responsible for their actions, and requiring real consequences for CEOs and corporations who break the law.

A Test of Leadership – Iraq. There are 822 men and women in uniform fighting in Iraq and Afghanistan from Wyoming, but the President's budget fails to include funding for America's military operations overseas. [DOD Legal Residence/ Home of Record for Service Members Deployed as of 11/04] The Republican attempt to hide the cost of this war is a failure of leadership. Democrats are ready to provide everything our men and women in uniform need for a successful mission, but the American people deserve an honest accounting of the cost.

A Test of Leadership – Social Security. The Republican plan to privatize Social Security will affect every worker in Wyoming. If their plan were in place today, the guaranteed monthly benefit for the 79,190 people receiving Social Security benefits in Wyoming would drop to \$387 – a cut of almost 50 percent. [AFL-CIO, 2/05; NWLC 2/05] The fact that Republicans have failed to provide a clear and honest accounting of the difficult trade-offs between increases in the debt, benefit cuts, and tax increases necessary to fund the White House's privatization proposal is a clear failure of leadership. Democrats stand ready to address the challenges facing Social Security, but the President must put forward a proposal that is fiscally responsible, fair, and does not slash benefits.
