



Some respondents have indicated multiple relationships to the VA on paper comment forms and other paper input, which is counted under the category named 'Multiple Selections on Paper Input'.





"My family donated a large portion of this land to the Federal government for the express purpose of providing facilities for war veterans and to provide an old soldier's home. Today the guardianship of this historic property is in the hands of a new generation. This land was a gift from my family and it is not to be sold by the government.
