**S. 2902
Federal Acquisition Institute Act of 2010**

*As ordered reported by the Senate Committee on Homeland Security
and Governmental Affairs on July 28, 2010*

S. 2902 would modify the Federal Acquisition Institute's (FAI's) role in setting and monitoring standards to train and certify the skills of the federal government's acquisition workforce. The legislation would clarify the objectives of the institute, and reorganize some responsibilities of the General Services Administration (GSA), the Office of Management and Budget (OMB), and FAI.

Based on information from GSA and OMB, CBO estimates that implementing the bill would have no significant effect on the federal budget because the legislation would not provide any new authorities for training the civilian acquisition workforce.

Pay-as-you-go procedures do not apply because enacting the legislation would not affect direct spending or revenues. S. 2902 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would not affect the budgets of state, local, or tribal governments.
