## A BILL

- To amend the Public Health Service Act to provide for the establishment of a drug-free workplace information clearinghouse, to support residential methamphetamine treatment programs for pregnant and parenting women, to improve the prevention and treatment of methamphetamine addiction, and for other purposes.

1	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
2	This Act may be cited as the "Methamphetamine
3	Education, Treatment, and Hope Act of 2010".
4	SEC. 2. ENHANCING HEALTH CARE PROVIDER AWARENESS
5	OF METHAMPHETAMINE ADDICTION.
6	Section 507(b) of the Public Health Service Act (42
7	U.S.C. 290bb(b)) is amended—
8	(1) by redesignating paragraphs (13) and (14)
9	as paragraphs (14) and (15), respectively; and

2	out this section, the Director shall expand, intensify, and
3	coordinate efforts to provide pregnant and parenting
4	women treatment for addiction to methamphetamine or
5	other drugs."; and

7	striking "such sums as may be necessary to fiscal
8	years 2001 through 2003" and inserting
9	" $$16,000,000$ for fiscal year 2012, $$16,500,000$ for

12	\$18,000,000 for fiscal year 2016".
