 On Tuesday, the Subcommittee on Insular Affairs, Oceans and Wildlife will hold an oversight hearing on the "Implementation of Public Law 110-229 to the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands and Guam." The hearing will allow leaders of the CNMI and Guam and federal officials to testify on the progress and status of the implementation of Title VII of P.L. 110-229. The hearing will also explore any concerns or problems that may have arisen since the law was enacted.

On Wednesday, the Subcommittee on Insular Affairs, Oceans and Wildlife will hold an oversight hearing in advance of the 61st meeting of the International Whaling Commission (IWC) to be held in Madeira, Portugal, from June 22-26. The hearing will focus on the policy positions of the United States with respect to proposals that could potentially undermine the moratorium on commercial whaling that has been in effect since 1986.

 On Thursday, the Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests and Public Lands will hold an oversight hearing on "The Future of the Forest Economy." The economic downturn has dramatically impacted the forest products industry, especially those companies reliant on wood from National Forest System lands. The hearing will server to review the current economic factors at play and explore options for getting the industry back on its feet.
