This Week's Hearings and Markups:

- On Wednesday, the **Committee on Natural Resources** will receive testimony on the following 4 bills:
 - H.R. 2678 (McDermott): To extend Federal recognition to the Duwamish Tribe, and for other purposes. "Duwamish Tribal Recognition Act"
 - H.R. 1358 (Stupak): To reaffirm and clarify the Federal relationship of the Burt Lake Band as a distinct federally recognized Indian Tribe, and for other purposes. "Burt Lake Band of Ottawa and Chippewa Indians Reaffirmation Act"
 - H.R. 3084 (Baird): To restore Federal recognition to the Chinook Nation, and for other purposes. "Chinook Nation Restoration Act"
 - H.R. 3120 (Rehberg): To extend the Federal relationship to the Little Shell Tribe of Chippewa Indians of Montana as a distinct federally recognized Indian tribe, and for other purposes. "Little Shell Tribe of Chippewa Indians Restoration Act of 2009"

In Case You Missed It:

- Last week, the House of Representatives approved the following 3 bills under the jurisdiction of the House Natural Resources Committee:
 - HR 1129 (Lynch): To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to provide an annual grant to facilitate an iron working training program for Native Americans.

- HR 1275 (Matheson): To direct the exchange of certain land in Grand, San Juan, and Uintah Counties, Utah, and for other purposes. "Utah Recreational Land Exchange Act of 2009"
- O HR 1945 (Nunes): To require the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study on the feasibility and suitability of constructing a storage reservoir, outlet works, and a delivery system for the Tule River Indian Tribe of the Tule River Reservation in the State of California to provide a water supply for domestic, municipal, industrial, and agricultural purposes, and for other purposes. "Tule River Tribe Water Development Act"
- On July 9, the **Committee on Natural Resources** approved the following 4 bills:
 - H.R. 1061 (Dicks): To transfer certain land to the United States to be held in trust for the Hoh Indian Tribe, to place land into trust for the Hoh Indian Tribe, and for other purposes. "Hoh Indian Tribe Safe Homelands Act"
 - H.R. 715 (Grijalva): To expand the boundary of Saguaro National Park, to study additional land for future adjustments to the boundary of the Park, and for other purposes. "Saguaro National Park Boundary Expansion and Study Act of 2009"
 - H.R. 1376 (Chet Edwards): To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to establish the Waco Mammoth National Monument in the State of Texas.
 "Waco Mammoth National Monument Establishment Act of 2009"
 - H.R. 1121 (Foxx): To authorize a land exchange to acquire lands for the Blue Ridge Parkway from the Town of Blowing Rock, North Carolina, and for other purposes. "Blue Ridge Parkway and Town of Blowing Rock Land Exchange Act of 2009"
