- This week, the **House of Representatives** approved the following bills under the jurisdiction of the House Natural Resources Committee:
 - H.R. 3689 (Rahall): To provide for an extension of the legislative authority of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund, Inc. to establish a Vietnam Veterans Memorial visitor center, and for other purposes.
 - H.R. 1593 (Larsen): To amend the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act to designate a segment of Illabot Creek in Skagit County, Washington, as a component of the National Wild and Scenic Rivers System.
 - H.R. 3537 (Ortiz): To amend and reauthorize the Junior Duck Stamp Conservation and Design Program Act of 1994. "Junior Duck Stamp Conservation and Design Program Reauthorization Act of 2009"
 - H.R. 3433 (Wittman): To amend the North American Wetlands Conservation Act to establish requirements regarding payment of the non-Federal share of the costs of wetlands conservation projects in Canada that are funded under that Act, and for other purposes.
 - H.R. 3476 (Garrett): To reauthorize the Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area Citizen Advisory Commission.
 - H.Res. 816 (Faleomavaega): Mourning the loss of life caused by the earthquakes and tsunamis that occurred on September 29, 2009, in American Samoa, Samoa, and Tonga.
 - H.R. 2442 (George Miller): To amend the Reclamation Wastewater and Groundwater Study and Facilities Act to expand the Bay Area Regional Water Recycling Program, and for other purposes. "Bay Area Regional Water Recycling Program Expansion Act of 2009"
