 On Monday, the Subcommittee on Water and Power will hold an oversight field hearing on "Perspectives on California Water Supply: Challenges and Opportunities." California is in its third year of an ongoing drought. The Subcommittee will examine the implications of recently enacted California State water legislation as well as the Department of the Interior's Interim Federal Action Plan for the California Bay-Delta. Testimony will focus on Southern California's innovations for dealing with drought and the projected water supply decreases for 2010.

 - <u>H.R. 4416</u> (George Miller): To reauthorize the Great Ape Conservation Act, and for other purposes. *"Great Ape Conservation Reauthorization Amendments Act of 2010"*

In Case You Missed It

• This week, the **House of Representatives** approved the following bills under the jurisdiction of the Committee on Natural Resources:

- <u>H.R. 3759</u> (DeFazio): To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to grant economy-related contract extensions of certain timber contracts between the Secretary of the Interior and timber purchasers. *"BLM Contract Extension Act"*
- <u>H.R. 725</u> (Pastor): To protect Indian arts and crafts through the improvement of applicable criminal proceedings. *"Indian Arts and Crafts Amendments Act of 2009"*
- <u>H.R. 1065</u> (Kirkpatrick): To resolve water rights claims of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in the State of Arizona. *"White Mountain Apache Tribe Water Rights Quantification Act of 2009"*
- <u>H.R. 3254</u> (Luján): To approve the Taos Pueblo Indian Water Rights Settlement Agreement. *"Taos Pueblo Indian Water Rights Settlement Act"*
- <u>H.R. 3342</u> (Luján): To authorize the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Commissioner of Reclamation, to develop water infrastructure in the Rio Grande Basin, and to approve the settlement of the water rights claims of the Pueblos of Nambe, Pojoaque, San Ildefonso, and Tesuque. *"Aamodt Litigation Settlement Act"*
