- On Thursday, the **Subcommittee on Water and Power** will receive testimony on the following bill:
 - <u>H.R. 4225</u> (Costa): To authorize drought assistance adjustments to provide immediate funding for projects and activities that will help alleviate record unemployment and diminished agricultural production related to the drought in California.

In Case You Missed It

- This week, the **House of Representatives** approved the following bills under the jurisdiction of the Committee on Natural Resources:
 - <u>H.R. 4474</u> (Minnick): To authorize the continued use of certain water diversions located on National Forest System land in the Frank Church-River of No Return Wilderness and the Selway-Bitterroot Wilderness in the State of Idaho, and for other purposes. *"Idaho Wilderness Water Facilities Act"*
 - <u>H.R. 3726</u> (Christensen): To establish the Castle Nugent National Historic Site at St. Croix, United States Virgin Islands, and for other purposes. "Castle Nugent National Historic Site Establishment Act of 2010"
 - <u>H.Res. 1020</u> (Betsy Markey): Honoring the 95th anniversary of the signing of the Rocky Mountain National Park Act.
