

The Weekly Preview March 8 – 12, 2010

This Week's Hearings and Markups

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On Wednesday, the Committee on Natural Resources will hold an oversight hearing on the "Proposed Settlement of the Cobell v. Salazar Litigation." In December 2009, plaintiffs and the United States announced a long-awaited settlement to the Cobell class-action lawsuit regarding the mismanagement of over three hundred thousand individual American Indian trust accounts. The settlement agreement, which would provide \$1.4 billion to settle accounting claims and create a \$2.0 billion Trust Land Consolidation Fund, must be approved by the Congress before going into effect. The Committee will receive testimony on the settlement agreement from representatives of the Department of Justice and the Department of the Interior, lead plaintiff Eloise Cobell, and Indian allottees.

- On Thursday, the **Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests and Public** Lands will receive testimony on the following bill:
 - <u>H.R. 4289</u> (DeGette): To designate certain lands in the State of Colorado as components of the National Wilderness Preservation System, and for other purposes. *"Colorado Wilderness Act of 2009"*

 Later on Thursday, the Subcommittee on Water and Power will hold an oversight hearing on "The President's Fiscal Year 2011 Budget Request for the Bureau of Reclamation and Water Resources Division of the United States Geological Survey (USGS), United States Department of the Interior." The hearing will focus on the proposed budgets for water monitoring, management and project administration. The Subcommittee will also receive testimony on efforts by the agencies to address challenges posed by aging infrastructure and to carry out Secretarial initiatives related to water and climate change.

In Case You Missed It

 On March 3, during a hearing of the House Subcommittee on Insular Affairs, Oceans and Wildlife, Chairwoman Madeleine Z. Bordallo (D-GU) called for National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration Office of Law Enforcement Director Dale Jones to be temporarily relieved of his duties, amid allegations of unauthorized document destruction during an ongoing investigation by the U.S. Department of Commerce's Inspector General (IG). The IG had recently released the findings of another investigation of NOAA Fisheries, which revealed "systemic, nationwide issues" affecting fishing industry law enforcement. "As the top cop at NOAA and a long-time investigator himself, Dale Jones must be acutely aware that shredding documents during a federal investigation raises serious questions about his commitment to a full and fair look at all the facts. At a time when transparency and accountability in the way our government operates is of utmost importance, this type of behavior cannot be condoned, and Mr. Jones should step aside until the IG's investigation is completed."
