• On Tuesday, the Subcommittee on Insular Affairs, Oceans and Wildlife will hold an oversight hearing on "Catch Shares As A Management Option: Criteria For Ensuring Success." Catch shares are a fishery management tool in which fishermen, cooperatives, or communities are allocated a specific portion of a total allowable fishing quota. While the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration is actively promoting this tool, there is not universal agreement on the merits of its use. The Subcommittee will receive testimony from expert witnesses who will provide recommendations on improving the design and execution of catch share programs.

 Later on Wednesday, the Subcommittee on Insular Affairs, Oceans and Wildlife will hold an oversight hearing on "The Proposed Virgin Islands Constitution From The Fifth Constitutional Convention." The Virgin Islands is one of two U.S. states and territories without its own constitution. The Subcommittee will receive testimony from a representative of the Department of Justice, Virgin Islands Governor John deJongh, and other local leaders on a constitution drafted by the Fifth Constitutional Convention of the Virgin Islands.

- On Thursday, the Subcommittee on Water and Power will receive testimony on the following bills:
 - H.R. 4349 (Napolitano): To further allocate and expand the availability of hydroelectric power generated at Hoover Dam, and for other purposes. "Hoover Power Allocation Act of 2009"
 - H.R. 4579 (Filner): To amend the Reclamation Wastewater and Groundwater Study and Facilities Act to authorize the Secretary of the Interior to participate in phase one of the South San Diego County Water Reclamation Project, and for other purposes. "South San Diego County Water Reclamation Project of 2009"
