- On Wednesday, the Committee on Natural Resources will receive testimony on the following bills:
 - H.R. 4445 (Heinrich): To amend Public Law 95-232 to repeal a restriction on treating as Indian country certain lands held in trust for Indian pueblos in New Mexico. "Indian Pueblo Cultural Center Clarification Act"
 - H.R. 1554 (Boren): To take certain property in McIntosh County, Oklahoma, into trust for the benefit of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation, and for other purposes. "Fountainhead Property Land Transfer Act"
 - O H.R. 2340 (Don Young): To resolve the claims of the Bering Straits Native Corporation and the State of Alaska to land adjacent to Salmon Lake in the State of Alaska and to provide for the conveyance to the Bering Straits Native Corporation of certain other public land in partial satisfaction of the land entitlement of the Corporation under the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act. On Thursday, the Subcommittee on Insular Affairs, Oceans and Wildlife will
hold an oversight hearing on "A Community Perspective on Catch Shares."
Catch shares are a fishery management tool in which fishermen, cooperatives,
or communities are allocated a specific portion of a total allowable fishing
quota. The Subcommittee held a hearing on March 16, 2010, that focused on
improving the design and execution of catch share programs. This hearing will

focus on individual communities' experiences and concerns related to the adoption of this management tool.

 - O H.R. 4888 (Doc Hastings): To revise the Forest Service Recreation Residence Program as it applies to units of the National Forest System derived from the public domain by implementing a simple, equitable, and predictable procedure for determining cabin user fees, and for other purposes. "Cabin Fee Act of 2010"
