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• On Tuesday, the Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests and Public Lands will hold an oversight hearing on "Building on America's Best Idea: The Next Century of the National Park System." The National Park Service (NPS) will mark its centennial anniversary in 2016. The Subcommittee will receive testimony from Administration officials and several members of the 2nd Century Commission, an independent commission that recently released a report on the future of the NPS. Other witnesses will discuss business partnerships, cultural and historic resource preservation, employee retention, and improved international cooperation.

- This week, the House of Representatives approved the following bills under the jurisdiction of the Committee on Natural Resources:
 - H.R. 2288 (Salazar): To amend Public Law 106-392 to maintain annual base funding for the Upper Colorado and San Juan fish recovery programs through fiscal year 2023. "Endangered Fish Recovery Programs Improvement Act of 2010"
 - H.Con.Res. 211 (George Miller): Recognizing the 75th anniversary of the establishment of the East Bay Regional Park District in California, and for other purposes.
 - H.R. 4491 (Speier): To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study of alternatives for commemorating and interpreting the role of the Buffalo Soldiers in the early years of the National Parks, and for other purposes. "Buffalo Soldiers in the National Parks Study Act"
 - H.Res. 1327 (Adrian Smith): Honoring the life, achievements, and contributions of Floyd Dominy.
