FULL COMMITTEE ACTION

Committee on Energy and Commerce

Wednesday, May 20, 2009

The Committee on Energy and Commerce met in open markup session to continue consideration of H.R. 2454, the American Clean Energy and Security Act of 2009.

Pending was the amendment in the nature of a substitute by Mr. Waxman and Mr. Markey, # 1, offered on May 18, 2009.

The following amendments were offered to the substitute amendment:

An amendment offered by Mr. Stearns, # 1Q, was defeated by a roll call vote: 26 – 30;

An amendment offered by Mr. Green, # 1R, was adopted by a voice vote;

An amendment offered by Mr. Shadegg, # 1S, was adopted by a voice vote;

By unanimous consent, the Shadegg amendment was modified to delete the text on the last line, after “media” up to the period. No objection.

An amendment offered by Ms. Sutton, # 1D, was adopted by a roll call vote: 50 – 4 – 1 voting present;

An amendment offered by Mr. Walden, # 1E, was defeated by a roll call vote: 26 – 32;

An amendment offered by Ms. Eshoo, # 1F, was adopted by a voice vote;

An amendment offered by Mr. Blunt, # 1G, was defeated by a roll call vote: 23 – 32;

An amendment offered by Ms. Baldwin, # 1H, was adopted by a roll call vote: 30 – 9;

An amendment offered by Ms. Baldwin, # 1M en bloc, with an amendment by Ms. Baldwin and an amendment by Mr. Rush, was adopted by a voice vote;

An amendment offered by Ms. Baldwin, # 1N en bloc, with an amendment by Mr. Inslee and an amendment by Ms. Schakowsky, was adopted by a roll call vote: 36 – 20;

An amendment offered by Ms. Blackburn, # 1O, was defeated by a roll call vote: 19 – 35;

An amendment offered by Ms. Castor, # 1P, was adopted by a roll call vote: 32 – 18;

An amendment offered by Mr. Stearns, # 1Q, was defeated by a roll call vote: 26 – 30;

An amendment offered by Mr. Green, # 1 R, was adopted by a voice vote;

An amendment offered by Mr. Shadegg, # 1X, was adopted by a voice vote;

Chairman Waxman asked unanimous consent that the language appearing at the end of the Shadegg amendment after the word “media”, up to the period, be deleted.

An amendment offered by Mr. Scalise, # 1V, was defeated by a roll call vote: 20 – 31;

An amendment offered by Mr. Matheson, # 1W, was adopted by a voice vote;

An amendment offered by Mr. Stearns, # 1X, was defeated by a roll call vote: 27 – 29;

An amendment offered by Mrs. Christensen, # 1Y, was adopted by a voice vote;

An amendment offered by Mr. McNerney, # 1Z en bloc, with the amendment by Mr. McNerney and an amendment by Ms. Baldwin, was adopted by a roll call vote: 34 – 21;

An amendment offered by Mr. Sullivan, # 1 AA, was adopted by a voice vote;

An amendment offered by Mr. Welch, # 1BB, was adopted by a division vote: 25 – 4;

An amendment offered by Ms. Eshoo, # 1CC, was adopted by a division vote: 26 – 10;

An amendment offered by Mr. Hill, # 1 DD, was adopted by a voice vote;

An amendment offered by Mr. Shadegg, # 1 EE en bloc, with three amendments by Mr. Shadegg, was defeated by a roll call vote: 22 – 34;

An amendment offered by Mr. Terry, # 1 DD, was offered but set aside to consider other amendments;

An amendment offered by Mr. Murphy of Pennsylvania, # 1 EE, was defeated by a roll call vote: 20 – 35;

The Terry amendment, # 1 DD, previously offered, was defeated by a roll call vote: 20 –

36;

An amendment offered by Mr. Burgess, # 1 GG, was defeated by a roll call vote: 22 – 35;

An amendment offered by Mr. Stupak, # 1 HH, was set aside to consider another amendment;

An amendment offered by Ms. Blackburn, # 1 II, was defeated by a roll call vote: 23 – 33;

The Stupak amendment, # 1HH, previously offered, was adopted by a roll call vote: 33 – 20; and

An amendment by Mr. Gingrey, # 1 KK, was defeated by a roll call vote: 4 – 52.
