#### The Committee Bill is:

- > \$105 million or 3.6% more than last year
- > \$215 million or 6.6% less than the request

**Budget Compliance**: According to CBO, the bill is within the 302(b) allocation provided for legislative branch appropriations and thus complies with the Budget Act.

<u>Unauthorized Appropriations</u>: According to the Committee report, the bill contains no unauthorized appropriations.

## **Comparison to the RSC Budget**

**Congressional Printing**. The Congressional Printing division of GPO prints approximately 5,300 copies of the Congressional Record daily when Congress is in session, at a cost of over \$6.5 million annually. Congressional Printing also prints several other large documents on a regular basis, which are delivered to Member offices daily. The Congressional Record, and all other documents distributed by Congressional Printing can be found on the Internet and are easily accessible to all congressional staff and Members. The RSC Budget eliminates funding for Congressional Printing. H.R.5521 provides \$95 million to GPO's combined congressional printing and binding activities.

**Government Printing Office**. The Government Printing Office (GPO) is responsible for the production and distribution of information products and services for all three branches of the federal government. With Internet access now widespread and with innovations in other electronic media, it is no longer necessary to allocate significant sums to the GPO. The RSC Budget proposes reducing the GPO's budget authority by 50 percent. H.R. 5521 provides \$131 million for the GPO, an increase of \$8 million over last year.

## **Items of Note:**

**Steering Committee Funding:** Provides \$924,000 for the Republican Steering Committee, the entity of Members that decides or "steers" Members to their respective committee assignments. It is not clear why a committee that does no legislative work and holds meetings so infrequently requires roughly \$1 million to perform its function. For point of comparison, the Democratic Steering and Policy Committee would receive \$2.2 million (a significant increase of \$200,000 over last year)—significantly more than the amount of funding for both the Steering Committee and the Republican Policy Committee, \$1.3 million combined.

**Committee Funding:** Provides \$26.5 million for the Appropriations Committee and \$124.8 million for the other standing committees for the 110<sup>th</sup> Congress.

**Excess MRA Funds for Deficit Reduction**: Continues language carried in previous years providing that excess funds in the Members' Representation Allowance Account shall be used for deficit reduction.

**Architect of the Capitol Inspector General**: Establishes an Office of the Inspector General within the Office of the Architect of the Capitol.

**Abraham Lincoln Bicentennial Commission**: Provides \$600,000 to the Commission, established in 2000 to study activities that may be carried out by the federal government to honor the bicentennial anniversary of Lincoln's birth—February 12, 2009. **Private Vehicles**: Prohibits funds in this bill from being used to maintain or otherwise care for privately-owned vehicles.

**Compensation Limitation**: Does not contain language from last year's House-passed legislative branch appropriations bill preventing any legislative branch employee from being paid more than a Member of the House or Senate (excluding in-kind benefits and related payments). Last year's provision was stripped in conference committee and was not included in this year's bill.

**Capitol Hill Visitors Center:** Provides \$46.2 million to complete the cost of construction and begin operating the Visitors Center.

**Rosa Parks Statue**: Provides \$370,000 for the Architect of the Capitol to construct a statue to honor Rosa Parks.

**Miscellaneous Items**: Provides \$703,000 for "miscellaneous items" including House automobiles (\$143,000), interparliamentary receptions (\$40,000) and "gratuities to beneficiaries of deceased staff [employees of the House]" (\$520,000).

**Open World Leadership Center:** Provides \$13.4 million for the Open World Leadership Center which exists to expose political leaders of foreign states to the workings of the U.S. government.

**Smoking in Rayburn Cafeteria**: Prohibits funds from being used to establish or operate a smoking area in the cafeteria and public dining rooms of the Rayburn House Office Building.

**Architect of the Capitol and GAO**: Provides the Comptroller General (GAO) with direct authority over the Architect of the Capitol for one year to execute and supervise all contracting, hiring, training, and employee compensation.
