**H.Con.Res. 456 — Providing for a correction to the enrollment of the bill,
S. 203—*as introduced* (Pombo, R-CA)**

Order of Business: The resolution is scheduled to be considered on Wednesday, July 26, 2006, under a motion to suspend the rules and pass the resolution.

Summary: H.Con.Res 456 resolves that, the Secretary of the Senate is to correct the enrollment of S. 203 by inserting a new section into the bill, which authorizes such sums as necessary to be used for technical assistance and the design and fabrication of interpretative materials, devices, and signs. The provision prohibits the federal share of the total cost of the project from exceeding 50 percent, and terminates the Secretary's authority under this provision on September 30, 2007.

H.Con.Res. 456 would also insert language into S. 203 directing the Secretary of the Interior, not later than 3 years after the date on which funds are made available, to prepare a strategic plan for the New Jersey Coastal Heritage Trail Route. The strategic plan would describe opportunities to increase participation by national and local private and public interests in the planning, development, and administration of the New Jersey Coastal Heritage Trail Route, as well as organizational options for sustaining the Heritage Trail Route.

Additional Background: Reportedly, these provisions were inadvertently left out of S. 203, which passed the House earlier in the week. To view the RSC Legislative Bulletin on S. 203, please see an RSC Legislative Bulletin from July 24, 2006.

Committee Action: Presumably, the resolution will be introduced today, July 26, 2006.

Cost to Taxpayers: There is no cost estimate available for this resolution. The resolution inserts language into S. 203, which authorizes such sums as necessary for a New Jersey Coastal Heritage Trail Route.

Does the Bill Expand the Size and Scope of the Federal Government?: No.

Does the Bill Contain Any New State-Government, Local-Government, or Private-Sector Mandates?: No.
