- H. Con. Res. 268, introduced by Rep. Maurice Hinchey. This measure supports the goals and ideals of National Women's Health Week.
- H. Res. 403, introduced by Rep. Ron Klein. This measure supports the goals and ideals of National Teacher Day. An amendment will be offered to make technical changes to the title of the measure.
- H. Res. 792, introduced by Rep. Bill Posey. This measure honors Robert Kelly Slater, the 2010 Rip Curl Pro Bell Champion. An amendment will be offered to make technical changes to the title of the measure.
- H. Res. 879, introduced by Rep. Walter Minnick. This measure supports the goals and ideals of American Education Week.
- H. Res. 1187, introduced by Rep. James Moran. This measure expresses the sense of the House of Representatives with respect to raising public awareness of and helping to prevent attacks against federal employees while engaged in or on account of the performance of official duties.
