Dear Secretary Gates:

We are writing to request that you direct your staff to cooperate with the Committee's investigation into sexual assault in the military.

On July 31, 2008, the National Security and Foreign Affairs Subcommittee held a hearing titled, "Oversight Hearing on Sexual Assault in the Military." On June 27, 2008, more than a month before the hearing, the Subcommittee invited Dr. Kaye Whitley, the Director of the Defense Department's Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Office, to testify. This office "serves as the single point of accountability for the Department of Defense sexual assault policy."

On July 10, 2008, staff for the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Legislative Affairs informed Committee staff by telephone that Dr. Whitley would not be permitted to testify.

On July 28, 2008, the Committee issued a subpoena for Dr. Whitley's testimony.³ This subpoena was supported by the Chairmen and Ranking Members of both the Full Committee and the National Security Subcommittee.

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At the hearing, the Subcommittee heard testimony from a sexual assault victim and the family member of a sexual assault victim, as well as the Government Accountability Office, which reported that over half of the women sexually assaulted in the military choose not to report the assaults, in part, because of "a belief that nothing would be done [and] a fear of ostracism."

Dr. Whitley did not appear at this hearing. Instead, Michael Dominguez, the Principal Deputy Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness, testified that he instructed Dr. Whitley not to testify at the hearing.⁵ He also stated that he had "consulted with the assistant secretary of defense for legislative affairs and general counsel of the Department of Defense" in making this decision.⁶

We believe the Department's actions are completely without justification. The Department has provided no valid legal basis for its decision to prevent a witness from complying with a duly authorized congressional subpoena. The President has not asserted executive privilege over the testimony of Dr. Whitley. During the hearing, Subcommittee Chairman Tierney asked Mr. Dominguez whether there had been any assertion of executive privilege, and he testified that there had not been.⁷

The Department's actions also may violate a statutory provision prohibiting the use of federal funds to pay the salary of any official who "prohibits or prevents ... any other officer or employee of the federal government from having any direct oral or written communication or contact with any member, committee, or subcommittee of the Congress in connection with any matter pertaining to ... the department or agency of such other officer or employee in any way."

We are writing today to request that you make Dr. Whitley available to testify before the Subcommittee. We ask that you respond to this letter by Monday, August 18, 2008, and inform the Committee whether you intend to comply. If the Department does not agree by this date to remove its restrictions on Dr. Whitley's testimony, the Committee will issue subpoenas for three Defense Department officials to appear at a hearing on Friday, September 12, 2008, on the Department's legal rationale for refusing to comply with the Committee's investigation. They are:
