Dear Administrator Johnson:

Thank you for providing my staff the opportunity to review documents relating to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) handling of the air permit application for the BHP Billiton liquefied natural gas (LNG) floating storage and re-gasification project off the coast of Ventura County, California. On March 23 and 27, my staff was able to review all but two of the documents that EPA has not provided to the Committee in response to my March 5, 2007, request.<sup>1</sup>

I have determined that many of these documents are relevant to the Committee's investigation. The documents indicate EPA developed a sound policy and legal basis for insisting that the project be permitted according to the air quality permitting requirements of the Ventura County Air Pollution Control District. The documents also indicate that this EPA position was reversed on June 29, 2005, after intervention from a political appointee, Jeff Holmstead, Assistant Administrator for Air and Radiation, who may have been acting after consultation with the White House. Finally, the documents indicate that the reversal of EPA's position is likely to result in degraded air quality in California, inconsistent application of air quality regulations, and potential enforcement difficulties for any mitigation project ultimately adopted by BHP Billiton.

Therefore, I am writing to request that EPA provide the relevant documents to the Committee without further delay. Specifically, I request that you provide the Committee with unredacted copies of the following documents:

• An e-mail and attachment from Paul Cort dated June 23, 2006. For purposes of document review, EPA labeled this "document number 1."
