H.Con.Res. 66 – Permitting the use of the rotunda of the Capitol for a ceremony as part of the commemoration of the days of remembrance of victims of the Holocaust

Floor Situation

H.Con.Res. 66 is being considered on the floor under suspension of the rules and will require a two-thirds majority vote for passage. This legislation was introduced by Representative Henry Waxman (D-CA) on February 15, 2007 and was referred to the House Committee on House Administration, but never considered.

H.Con.Res. 66 is expected to be considered on March 21, 2007.

*Note: In the 109th Congress identical bills (H.Con.Res.63 and H.Con.Res.350) were introduced in the House of Representatives on February 15, 2005 and March 2, 2006. The bills were agreed to in the House and Senate.

Summary

H.Con.Res 66 authorizes the Rotunda to be used for a ceremony on April 19, 2007 remembering the victims of the Holocaust.

Cost CBO has not scored H. Con. Res. 66.
