Dear Chairman Levin, Ranking Member Inhofe, Chairman McKeon, and Ranking Member Smith:

We write to express our strong support for the enactment of Section 316 of S. 2410, the Senate version of the *Fiscal Year 2015 National Defense Authorization Act*. We urge you to retain this Senate provision as you reconcile S. 2410 and H.R. 4435. This provision was adopted with strong bipartisan support at the markup of S. 2410 by the Senate Armed Services Committee.

Section 316 of S. 2410 will provide the Department of Defense with the full authority it needs to remove a public safety threat that exists on the Northwest Peninsula of Culebra, Puerto Rico. The land, which was used as a military training range for seven decades, remains contaminated with unexploded ordnance and other dangerous military munitions. Congress required DOD to study this issue pursuant to Section 2815 of the *National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2011* (P.L. 111-383). DOD submitted a comprehensive report in 2012, identifying four specific areas on the property where there is a meaningful risk of the public encountering UXO.

Alone among the thousands of formerly used defense sites (FUDS) in the nation, this particular piece of property on Culebra is subject to statutory constraints that—DOD asserts—prevent DOD from carrying out its regular decontamination responsibilities. This is a unique problem warranting a targeted, narrowly-tailored legislative solution. Section 316 would align this piece of property with all other FUDS sites, including numerous other sites on Culebra, and provide DOD with the authority to take appropriate decontamination action. This provision does not seek special treatment for these four areas on Culebra; it simply seeks equal treatment, no better and no worse than is provided for all other FUDS sites.

Thousands of people from the U.S. mainland and Puerto Rico visit Culebra each year. The safety of these visitors, as well as of residents of Culebra, will remain at risk as long as this issue is not addressed. Section 316 is a compromise provision, which CBO indicates does not score, and it will resolve this issue once and for all if enacted.
