WHO

Current high school students who live or are enrolled in a public or private high school in California's 26th Congressional District.

WHAT

The U.S. Congressional App Challenge is a competition aimed at encouraging high school students to learn how to code by creating their own applications. Students will create either a desktop-based, web-based or mobile app. To enter the competition, students will submit a YouTube video explaining their app and documenting what they learned throughout the process.

WHEN

Submissions for the Congressional App Challenge will be accepted July 18, 2016 through November 2, 2016 .

HOW

WHY

The Challenge is intended to highlight the value of computer science and STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) education and encourage students to engage in these fields.
