However, in the case of a child who is age 18 or older, states are only required to report data on youth in foster care who are under the state's legal age of majority. Any youth age 18 and older who is eligible for Title IV-E foster care assistance must also be included in the state's AFCARS report. (See *Child Welfare Policy Manual*, Section 1.3, Q&A 2.) Before FY2011, no child who was age 19 or older could be eligible for Title IV-E. Accordingly, while data shown here reflect reports by states on youth in care age 18 or older they do not necessarily reflect all youth in care of that age.
