AN ACT

To require the conveyance of certain National Forest System lands in Mendocino National Forest, California, to provide for the use of the proceeds from such conveyance for National Forest purposes, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. LAND CONVEYANCE, FARAWAY RANCH, 4 MENDOCINO NATIONAL FOREST, CALI-5 FORNIA.

6 (a) CONVEYANCE REQUIRED.—Subject to subsection7 (b), the Secretary of Agriculture shall convey to the owner

of the property known as the Faraway Ranch in Lake
 County, California (in this section referred to as the "re cipient"), by quitclaim deed, all right, title, and interest
 of the United States in and to the following National For est System lands in Mendocino National Forest in Lake
 County, California:

7 (1) "Faraway Ranch, Tract 39" (approximately
8 15.8 acres), consisting of a portion of lot 6 of sec9 tion 4, township 18 north, range 10 west, Mount
10 Diablo base and meridian, as generally depicted on
11 the map entitled "Faraway Ranch, Tracts 39 and
12 40" and dated June 30, 2002.

(2) "Faraway Ranch, Tract 40" (approximately
105.1 acres) consisting of a portion of the N1/
2SW1/4 and lot 7 of section 4, and a portion of lots
15 and 16 of section 5, township 18 north, range 10
west, Mount Diablo base and meridian, as generally
depicted on the map referred to in paragraph (1).

(b) TIME FOR CONVEYANCE.—The Secretary shall
make the conveyance under subsection (a) not later than
120 days after the date on which the recipient deposits
sufficient funds with the Bureau of Land Management,
California State Office, Branch of Geographic Services, to
cover survey work costs and with the Forest Service,

Mendocino National Forest, to cover Forest Service direct
 transaction costs described in subsection (e).

3 (c) CORRECTIONS.—With the agreement of the re-4 cipient, the Secretary may make minor corrections to the 5 legal descriptions and map of the lands to be conveyed 6 pursuant to this section.

7 (d) CONSIDERATION.—As consideration for the con-8 veyance under subsection (a), the recipient shall pay to 9 the Secretary an amount equal to the fair market value 10 of the National Forest System lands conveyed under such subsection. The fair market value of such lands shall be 11 12 determined by an appraisal that is acceptable to the Sec-13 retary and conforms with the Federal appraisal standards, as defined in the Uniform Appraisal Standards for Fed-14 15 eral Land Acquisitions developed by the Interagency Land Acquisition Conference. 16

(e) PAYMENT OF COSTS.—All direct transaction costs
associated with the conveyance under section (a), including the costs of appraisal, title, and survey work, shall be
paid by the recipient.

21 (f) USE OF PROCEEDS.—

(1) DEPOSIT.—The Secretary shall deposit the
amounts received by the Secretary as consideration
under subsection (d) in the fund established by Pub-

3	(2) USE.—Funds deposited under paragraph
4	(1) shall be available to the Secretary until ex-
5	pended, without further appropriation—
6	(A) for the acquisition of land and inter-
7	ests in land for National Forest System pur-
8	poses in the State of California; and
9	(B) for reimbursement of costs incurred by
10	the Forest Service in making the conveyance
11	under subsection (a).
12	(3) STATUS OF ACQUIRED LAND.—Notwith-
13	standing Public Law 85–862 (16 U.S.C. 521a), any
14	lands acquired under paragraph (2)(A) shall be
15	managed as lands acquired under the Act of March
16	1, 1911 (commonly known as the Weeks Act; 16
17	U.S.C. 480, 500, 515 et seq.), regardless of whether
18	any of the lands conveyed under subsection (a) were
19	reserved from the public domain.
20	SEC. 2. WITHDRAWAL.
21	Subject to valid existing rights, the lands to be con-
22	veyed under subsection (a) of section 1 are hereby with-
23	drawn from all forms of location, entry, and patent under
. .	

24 the public land laws and the mining and mineral leasing25 laws of the United States.
