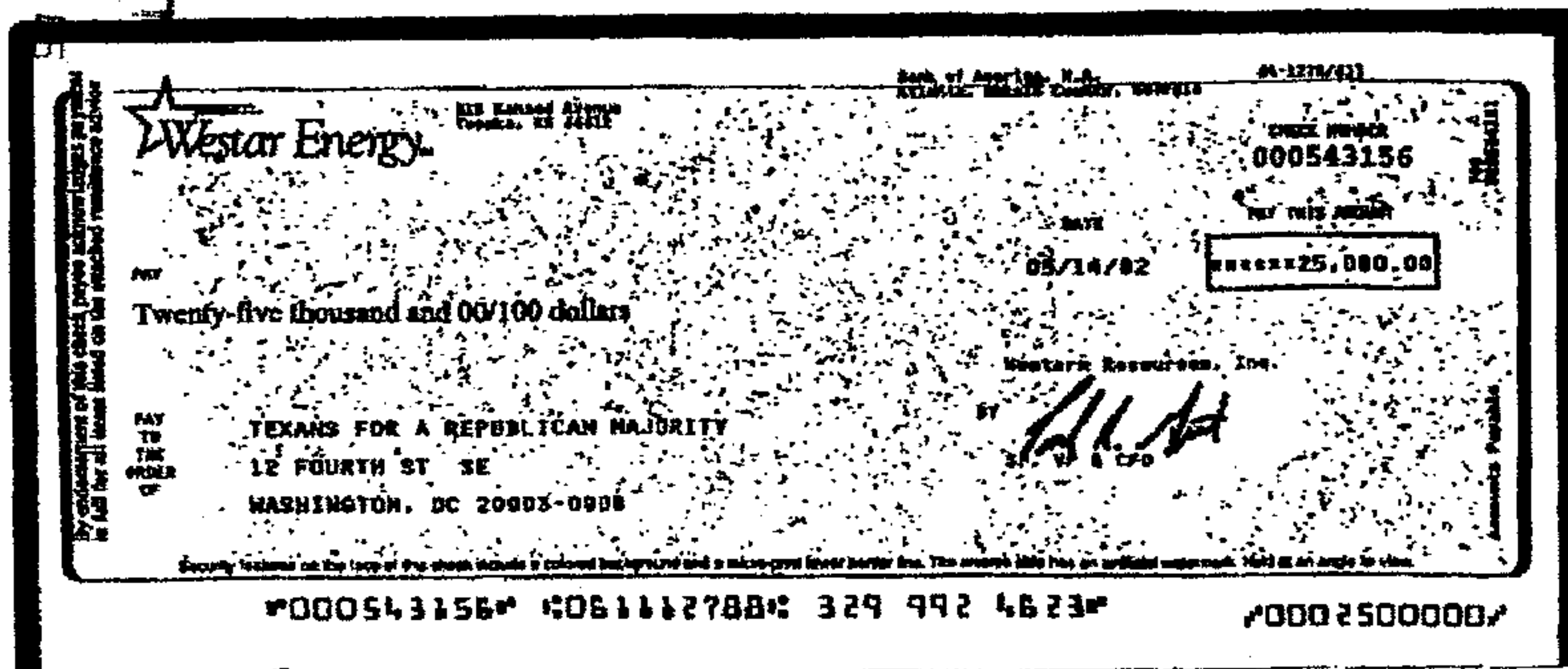



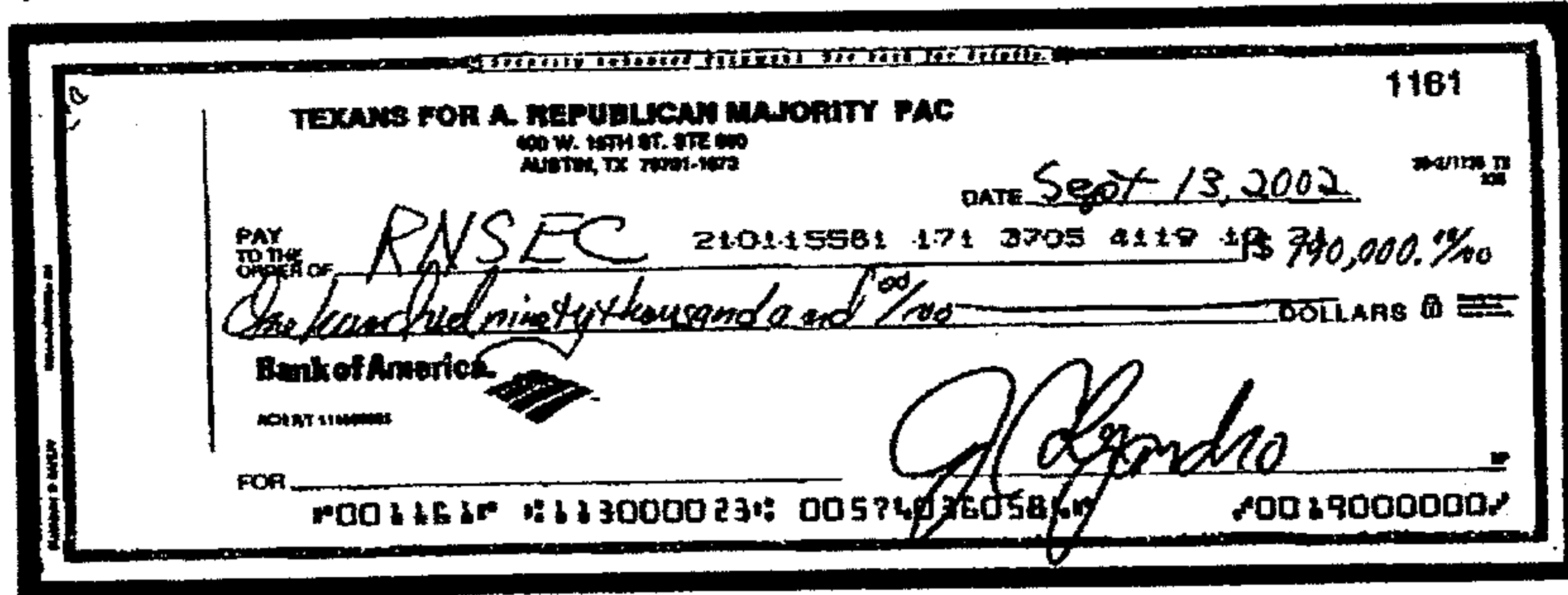

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER PRESENT THAT the following acts constituted the aforesaid transaction: on or about the aforesaid date, the defendant, JAMES W. ELLIS, delivered the check reproduced below to the Republican National Committee; on or about the aforesaid date, the defendant, JAMES W. ELLIS, provided the Republican National Committee with a list containing the names of several candidates to whom he suggested that the Republican National Committee make political contributions and containing corresponding dollar amounts that he suggested that the Republican National Committee contribute to each candidate; as a result of the Republican National Committee's receipt and acceptance of the said check and the said list, the Republican National State Elections Committee, the nonfederal component of

the Republican National Committee, made campaign contributions totaling \$190,000 to the following candidates for the Texas House of Representatives: Todd Baxter, Dwayne Bohac, Glenda Dawson, Dan Flynn, Rick Green, Jack Stick, and Larry Taylor.



THE GRAND JURY FURTHER PRESENT that the aforesaid transaction involved the following funds that constituted proceeds of criminal activity: \$50,000 that constituted the proceeds of a political contribution that was unlawfully made to Texans for a Republican Majority PAC by Diversified Collection Services, Inc.; \$25,000 that constituted the proceeds of a political contribution that was unlawfully made to Texans for a Republican Majority PAC by Sears, Roebuck and Co.; \$25,000 that constituted the proceeds of a political contribution that was unlawfully made to Texans for a Republican Majority PAC by the Williams Companies, Inc.; \$10,000 that constituted the proceeds of a political contribution that was unlawfully made to Texans for a Republican Majority PAC by Cornell Companies, Inc.; \$20,000 that constituted the proceeds of a political contribution that was unlawfully made to Texans for a Republican Majority PAC by Bacardi U.S.A., Inc.; and \$25,000 that constituted the proceeds of a political contribution that was unlawfully made to Texans for a Republican Majority PAC by Questerra Corporation,
