IMPROVING SCHOOL SAFETY




DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE (\$213M)

- Fully funds the FBI's National Instant Criminal Background Check System
- Increases funding for the U.S. Attorneys and U.S. Marshals to address violent crime
- Provides funding for Department of Justice grant programs that help keep schools safe:
 - **\$75M** for school safety grants
 - **\$10M** for the VALOR Initiative (police officer safety and wellness programs)
 - **\$10M** for the Police Act grants (active shooter training for police)
 - **\$94M** for Youth Mentoring Grants (peer-to-peer mentoring for at-risk youth)
- \$20M for Violent Crime and Gun Crime Reduction / Project Safe Neighborhoods (gang enforcement efforts)
- \$4M for Gang and Youth Violence Education and Prevention

DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION (\$1.9B)

- Provides **\$90M** for school safety national activities that **improve students' safety and well-bein**g during and after the school day
- Includes the longstanding Project SERV program that provides counseling and referrals for mental health services for schools affected by violent or traumatic crisis
- Includes \$1.1B for Student Support and Academic Enrichment Grants that support safe and healthy students, including school mental health services, bullying and harassment prevention, mentoring and school counseling, and training for school personnel



DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES (\$205M)

\$71M

for Project AWARE to provide state educational grants, grants to promote resilience in communities facing civil unrest, and mental health first aid grants

\$26M

for Healthy Transitions to provide grants to states to improve access to mental disorder treatment and support services for young people facing mental health conditions

\$13M

for SAMHSA's Minority
Fellowship program to
improve behavioral health
care outcomes for racial
and ethnic minority
populations

\$75M

to help expand the behavioral health workforce, including in rural and medically underserved areas, and increase access to child and adolescent services
