# STEM Scholars Tackle Ecology and the Environment

The #STEMScholars and I enjoyed a fantastic visit to the Loyola University Retreat and Ecology Center (LUREC) this month to study ecology and rub shoulders with Loyola scientists including Dr. Roberta Lammers-Campbell, Director of Academic Programs and Ecological Restoration, and Rev. Stephen Mitten, Director of Undergraduate Research. Students had a first-hand look at what a career in ecology and environmental sciences could look like, and we all got our hands dirty clearing out invasive species.

#### Topics tackled included:

- History and changing natural landscape of LUREC over the decades, and restoration efforts including clearing land, ridding the property of invasive species and undoing man-made drainage ditches. Native vegetation and animal, bird and insect species have returned following reclamation efforts, including the endangered rusty patched bumble bee.
- Definitions and importance of Ecology, Environmental Science and Sustainability.
- Geoplotting of all of LUREC trees and certain plant species and insects.
- Award-winning graduate student projects including longitudinal studies of bird counting and fish identification.
- The effects of a changing climate and the importance of environmental stewardship and biodiversity.

# New Prescription Monitoring Program Will Help Illinois



The men and women on the front lines of the opioid fight have been making the case for a statewide tracking database. This was also one of the key recommendations of my 2017 <a href="Community Action">Community Action</a>

#### Plan to Combat Heroin and Opioid Abuse.

It's why I support the mandatory prescription drug monitoring program in Illinois which was signed into law by Governor Bruce Rauner this month. This program will require physicians who prescribe opioids and other controlled substances to register with the state's database, preventing patients from getting multiple opioid prescriptions from multiple health care providers.

# President Trump: Tell Turkey to Release Istanbul 10



Last June, Turkish authorities detained Mr. Taner Kiliç, Chair of Amnesty International Turkey, Ms. Idil Eser, Director of Amnesty International Turkey, and nine other human rights defenders. Those arrested on July 5th are collectively known as the Istanbul 10 and include some of Turkey's leading human rights figures.

As Co-Chairs of the Tom Lantos Human Rights Commission, Congressman Jim McGovern (D-MA) and I sent a bipartisan letter, along with 43 Members of Congress, to President Trump urging him to publicly call on Turkey to halt the prosecution, drop all charges and immediately and unconditionally release those still in detention.

We write: "if these prosecutions are allowed to move forward without a clear response from the United States government, a

precedent will be set that will not only threaten the legitimate work of Amnesty International and other human rights organizations, but will also embolden authoritarian regimes around the world."

# Holding Burundi Government Accountable

Since 2015, in Burundi there have been more than 2,000 people killed, 200,000 internally displaced persons and more than 420,000 refugees spilling into neighboring countries. Along with Rep. Eliot L. Engel (D-NY), Ranking Member of the House Committee on Foreign Affairs, and Rep. Karen Bass (D-CA) I introduced a resolution calling on Burundi's political opposition to renounce violence and urged the government to comply with constitutional limits on presidential terms and re-engage in regional peace negotiations.

The people of Burundi have undergone immense atrocities in their recent history, and deserve a strong response from the international community. By bringing attention to the multi-faceted conflict taking place there, we remind those who are suffering and displaced that they are not forgotten.
