## **VETERANS CHOICE PROGRAM (VCP)**

## Details on the Unusual or Excessive Burden Eligibility Criteria

Veterans who are enrolled in the VA health care system **<u>and</u>** live more than 40 miles driving distance from the nearest VA medical facility with a full-time primary care physician may be eligible for the VCP. If Veterans have difficulty reaching the closest VA medical facility for any of a number of reasons listed below they could qualify under the unusual or excessive burden eligibility determination.

Burdens	Details	Examples
Geographic Challenges	A Veteran needs to travel around a large body of water, over a mountain, or needs to navigate a similar geographic barrier.	<ul><li>Crossing a mountain range</li><li>Navigating across a wide lake</li></ul>
Environmental Factors	A Veteran's trip to the closest VA medical facility is blocked by traffic conditions such as a road that is inaccessible to the general public, or a prolonged road closure, or by hazardous weather conditions.	<ul> <li>Roads blocked by military bases or other restricted areas</li> <li>Road closures due to construction</li> <li>Roads that are particularly dangerous during winter</li> </ul>
Medical Condition	A Veteran has a medical condition, as confirmed by the local medical facility's Primary Care Patient Aligned Care Team (PACT Team), which impacts his or her ability to travel.	<ul> <li>Vision problems</li> <li>Limited mobility</li> <li>Reduced focus or mental sharpness</li> </ul>
<b>Other Factors</b>	A Veteran could be determined eligible based on the nature, simplicity, or frequency of the care he or she needs. This includes instances where a Veteran's VA medical provider confirms that he or she requires an attendant to accompany him or her to a medical appointment either because of a medical condition or the type of procedure needed.	<ul> <li>Outpatient physical therapy</li> <li>Certain IV (parenteral infusions)</li> <li>Upper and/or lower extremity joint or soft tissue (trigger point) injections</li> <li>Optometry care such as a glaucoma screening or a diabetic retinal exam</li> <li>Hearing evaluation</li> <li>Allergy shots</li> </ul>

If you think you may be eligible for the VCP based on one of the reasons listed above, please contact your local VA medical facility. A staff member will work with you to determine eligibility. If you are determined eligible, staff will provide you with information about making an appointment for care through the program.
