## Membership

The State Fair Board includes seventeen members. Of these members, seven are elected, one from each of seven districts. ${ }^{1}$ Districts include the following counties:

## Terms

## Length of Term

The term of the elected member begins October 1 after the expiration of the term of the member whom the individual is elected to succeed. ${ }^{3}$ The terms expire on September 30 of the fourth year. ${ }^{4}$

## Reelection

A member may be reelected for a new term. ${ }^{5}$

## Cap on Years to Serve

An individual may not serve as a member for more than eight years in any twelve year period. ${ }^{6}$

## Vacancies

Any vacancies on the board will be filled by the Governor. ${ }^{7}$ The period of the unexpired term for which an individual serves after appointment may not be considered in determining the number of years they have served in a twelve (12) year period for purposes of the term cap. ${ }^{8}$

## Certification to Vote

## Who Must Apply

If an organization wants to be certified to vote, the organization must apply to ISDA's Director. ${ }^{9}$

## Certification Checklist

ISDA's Director shall certify the organization only if all the following apply:
$\square$ organization is an agricultural interest (part of one of the entities below)
$\square$ The Farm Bureau, Inc.
$\square$ The Farmers' Union
$\square$ The Grange
$\square$ The National Farmers Organization
$\square$ A county or other regularly organized agricultural fair, including county 4-H fairs
$\square$ The beef cattle industry
$\square$ The dairy cattle industry
$\square$ The grain growers' industry
$\square$ The home economic clubs
$\square$ The horticulture industry
$\square$ Horse associations
$\square$ The poultry industry
$\square$ The sheep industry
$\square$ The swine industry
$\square$ The vegetable growers' industry
$\square$ County cooperative extension boards, OR
$\square$ Soil and water conservation districts ${ }^{10}$
$\square$ organization is regularly organized within the district;
$\square$ organization has at least ten (10) active members;
$\square$ organization has elected officers;
$\square$ organization has an annual meeting;
$\square$ organization has been in existence for at least one (1) year before the application for certification is filed with the ISDA Director
$\square$ before July 1 of the election year, organization files with ISDA's Director:
$\square$ the name of the organization;
$\square$ the names and addresses of the organization's officers;
$\square$ the name, address, and title of the individual authorized by the organization to vote for them;
$\square$ the number of the organization's active members;
$\square$ a certification that the organization is eligible to be certified; and
$\square$ information required by ISDA's Director ${ }^{11}$

## Expiration of Certification

A certification expires July 1 of the fourth year after it is issued by ISDA's Director. ${ }^{12}$

## Types of Organizations to Certify

## Statewide Organizations

If the organization has an affiliated organization:

1. in any county of a district, only the county affiliates may be certified.
2. within the district, only the district organization may be certified. The district organization may cast only one vote in a district election.
If (1) and (2) do not apply, the organization may be certified. The organization may cast only one vote in a district election. ${ }^{13}$

## District Level Organizations

1. If the organization has an affiliated organization in any county of a district, only the county affiliates may be certified.
If (1) does not apply, the organization may be certified. The organization may cast only one vote in a district election. ${ }^{1}$

## COUNTY REPRESENTING AN AGRICULTURAL INTEREST

The ISDA Director may not certify more than two organizations in a county representing an agricultural interest described in any subdivision of IC 15-1.5-1-2. ${ }^{15}$
If more than two organizations in a county representing an agricultural interest apply for certification, the ISDA Director may certify any two organizations, considering the following criteria:
$\square$ Order of application for certification
$\square$ Number of members of each organization
$\square$ How long each organization has been in existence
$\square$ Activity of each organization in promotion of agricultural interests, and
$\square$ Diversity of representation of interests within the agricultural community ${ }^{16}$

## Convention

## Notice

Before September 1 of the year the term of a member representing a district expires, the ISDA Director shall notify each agricultural interest certified within the member's district that a convention will be held to elect the member to represent the district.
The ISDA Director shall state the following in the notice:
$\square$ the time and the place of the convention, and
$\square$ the name of the presiding officer

The ISDA Director shall choose a time and a place that will encourage maximum participation in the convention by certified agricultural interests. ${ }^{17}$

## Sending Credentials

The ISDA Director shall send copies of the credentials of each individual entitled to vote in a convention to the following:
$\square$ The board member representing the district, and
$\square$ The individual who will preside over the district convention. ${ }^{18}$

## Presiding Officer

The ISDA Director shall choose the individual to preside at a district convention from among the members of the State Fair Commission. As the Director "or the director's designee" is a member of the Commission, the Director may simply delegate someone from ISDA to be the presiding officer. ${ }^{19}$
The presiding officer of the convention may vote in the case of a tie vote on any matter. ${ }^{20}$

## Convention for election of member's successor

During the month of September before the term of a member representing a district expires, the individuals designated to vote for the organization within an election within the district shall meet in a convention to elect the member's successor.
Voting shall be by voice concurrent with the submission of a signed written ballot by each person voting indicating the person's vote. ${ }^{21}$

## Convention Election

## Sufficient Credentials to Vote

Except if contested, the credentials issued are conclusive of the right to vote at the convention. ${ }^{22}$

## Contesting Validity of Credentials

A person may contest the validity of the credentials of an individual by
alleging facts constituting fraud or misrepresentation in securing the credentials
$\square$ the affidavit must be filed with the presiding officer of the convention not later than the date of the convention
If a person contests the validity of a delegate's credentials, the validity of the credentials is determined by a majority vote of all delegates representing the county of the delegate whose credentials are contested. ${ }^{23}$

## District Convention

## Credentials to Vote

Except as provided in section 16 [Presiding officer at convention], an individual may not vote at a district convention if the individual does not have valid credentials issued under this chapter. ${ }^{24}$

## CRITERIA FOR INDIVIDUAL TO BE ELECTED TO REPRESENT DISTRICT

To be elected to represent a district, an individual must:be a resident within the district; andhave the other qualifications to be a member of the board under this chapter. ${ }^{25}$

## REPRESENTATIVE OF DISTRICT

If an individual receives a majority of the votes cast at a convention, the individual is elected to represent the district. ${ }^{26}$

## Elections

## Certify the Election

The presiding officer of a convention shall certify the election under section 21 [Criteria for individual to be elected to represent district]to the commission and to the board. ${ }^{27}$

## Create Rules

The ISDA Director shall adopt rules for the business of a convention. ${ }^{28}$
ISDA may create administrative rules to help implement certifying elections. ${ }^{29}$
