

Military Naturalization Checklist

Please include the following items in one package when applying for naturalization:

1 Completed Form N-400, Application for Naturalization

Make sure to sign and date fields within Part 13, Page 17.

2 Completed Form N-426, Request for Certification of Military or Naval Service

If you are currently serving in the U.S. armed forces, an officer in the grade of O-6 or higher (or the civilian equivalent) must sign the document to certify your service. Take the form to your chain of command for signature.

Attach a copy of your DD-214 if you are no longer in the service. In this situation, the portion after your signature block, Part 4, does not need to be completed.

3 Completed G-1145, E-Notification of Application/Petition Acceptance (optional)

We can notify you by text message and/or email when we accept your form.

4 Two passport style photos

Passport photos are only required if you reside outside the United States.

5 Proof of U.S. military service

6 Copies of any pertinent documents

If you are a Lawful Permanent Resident, provide any documents to show a change that happened after you obtained your Green Card. For example, you could provide marriage certificates, divorce decrees, and birth certificates.

7 Certified copy of police and court documents if you have been arrested within the last year

Failure to send the certified documents with your Form N-400 will slow down the application process.
