Chapter 1.

AN ACT concerning the Public Archives.

Passed January 5, 1850.

The People of the State of California, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

§ 1. That the Secretary of State be and is hereby instructed to call upon, ask, and receive of the Cortain Doculate Secretary of the State of California, all public records, registers, maps, books, papers, rolls, tained from late documents, and other writings, which he may have in his possession, which appertain to, or are in any wise connected with the political, civil, and military history, and past administration of the Government in California; the titles to bonds within the territory, or to any other subject which may be interesting, or valuable as references or authorities to the Government, or people of the State. § 2. This Act shall be in force from and after its passage, and a certified copy thereof shall be commencement filed in the office of the Secretary of State.
