Brian D. Lacefield State Executive Director, Kentucky

Brian D. Lacefield was appointed by the Trump Administration to serve as the state executive director of the Kentucky USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) in October 2017.

Lacefield grew up in Princeton, Kentucky. He graduated from Western Kentucky University with a bachelor's degree and master's degree in agriculture. He also has a master's degree in food and resource economics from the University of Florida.

Prior to joining the Trump administration, Lacefield served in various roles in the agriculture industry, most recently as market president at Trigg County FNB Bank. He has also worked as chief financial officer of Agri-Chem and general manager for Commonwealth Agri-Finance, both divisions of Hopkinsville Elevator Cooperative.

He served as vice president of agriculture and commercial banking with Planters Bank and as an area extension specialist with the University of Kentucky Farm Business Management Program.

Lacefield has been a board member for the Kentucky Retail Federation, Kentucky Corn Growers, Kentucky FFA Foundation, and the Kentucky Ag Leadership Program. Over the past decade, he has served nonprofits and charitable organizations in his communities including Cadiz Rotary, the United Way of the Pennyryle and the Hopkinsville Farmers Market.
