David McCurdy State Executive Director, Alabama

David McCurdy was appointed by the Trump Administration to serve as the state executive director of the Alabama USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) in December 2017.

McCurdy grew up on a farm in Lowndes County, Alabama, where he raised livestock. He attended Auburn University, earning a bachelor's degree in animal dairy science in 1985.

After college, McCurdy began his career as a salesperson with Moorman's Feed Company in 1986. He became a county operations trainee with FSA in 1987 and went on to serve as the county executive director for Elmore, Montgomery, Tallapoosa, and Coosa counties. Prior to his appointment, McCurdy covered 10 FSA county offices as district director for nearly seven years.

Throughout his career, he has served as a member of Elmore County Cattleman's Association, Elmore County Turkey Federation Committee, Coosa County Treasure Forest Association Committee, Montgomery County Farm City Committee and Montgomery Cattleman's Association. He is also a past advisor to the Montgomery County Farmers Federation Board.

McCurdy currently resides in Montgomery County where he enjoys spending time on the farm, hunting and fishing.
