Nancy Johner State Executive Director, Nebraska

Nancy Johner was appointed by the Trump Administration to serve as the state executive director of the Nebraska USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) in November 2017.

Johner has over 25 years of public service experience, including serving as the USDA Under Secretary of Food, Nutrition and Consumer Services. In this executive leadership role, she was responsible for administering a \$64 billion budget and had oversight of 15 nationwide nutrition assistance programs, including the food stamp program.

Following her time as under secretary, Johner served as the deputy chief of staff for Mike Johanns, previous United States Senator. She earlier held a key post with the State of Nebraska, serving as the director of the Department of Health and Human Services. Johner most recently served as chief executive officer of Pathfinder Support Services, an organization devoted to families involved in the child welfare and probation system.

Johner's public service record is underpinned by her educational background. She earned her bachelor's degree in social work from the University of Nebraska-Kearney and is now working toward her master's degree in management and leadership from Doane University.

She is a native of Scottsbluff, Nebraska, and currently resides in Milford with her husband and two dogs.
