Tas Smith State Executive Director, Georgia

Tas Smith was appointed by the Trump Administration to serve as the state executive director of the Georgia USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) in November 2017.

Smith grew up in Butler, Georgia. He earned a bachelor's degree in political science from Valdosta State University and a Masters of Business Administration from Tiffin University.

Smith worked in governmental affairs for Georgia Farm Bureau for 12 years, advocating for farmers across Georgia in legislative and regulatory arenas.

In 2010, Smith graduated from the Georgia Agri-Leaders Institute, which helps develop future agriculture leaders in Georgia. He was also named by James Magazine as a top 20 association lobbyist in the state of Georgia for his federal affairs work at Georgia Farm Bureau.
