He served on many local and state boards focused on conservation and natural resources, including the Rhode Island State Conservation Committee. He is a member of numerous professional organizations, including the American Society of Agronomy and the Soil Science Society of America.

Until 2013, Sullivan owned and operated a crop and beef farm in West Kingston. He now resides in Narragansett, Rhode Island.
