SUBJECT: Use of Mixed-Case Letters in Select NWS National

Central Pacific Hurricane Center Products Effective

June 1, 2016

Effective Wednesday, June 1, 2016, the NWS will expand its mixed-case text product suite to include select products (Table 1) issued by the Central Pacific Hurricane Center (CPHC). The first issuance of the text products in Table 1, in mixed-case, will be 1200 Coordinated Universal Time (UTC), or 2:00 AM Hawaii Standard Time (HST), June 1, 2016.

NWS began using mixed-case letters and the expanded punctuation/character set experimentally in October 2010 and operationally in May 2016. (Table 2):

These products will continue to be issued using mixed-case text through the end of the 2016 Central Pacific Hurricane Season, normally November 30; however, partners and users should be aware these products may revert back to using all uppercase letters at any time if the CPHC determines it to be necessary to meet operational requirements.

Use of mixed-case letters in text products will make them easier to read and allow users to click on Internet links directly rather than converting them to lowercase or mixed case.
