Other spending includes the Special Milk Program, Food Service Management Institute, Team Nutrition, coordinated review, computer support and processing, child nutrition grants for the Northern Marianas and American Samoa, and other activities. It also includes several projects funded in the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010 and discretionary projects funded in annual appropriation acts.
