Advocacy: the voice of small business in government

United States

Small businesses have a significant impact on the United States economy. They represent 99.7 percent of all employers, and employ 49.1 percent of the private-labor force. Small businesses are crucial to the nation's fiscal condition and they numbered 27.8 million in 2010.

This profile uses the latest available data to illustrate the status of U.S. small businesses. (Note that a small business is defined as one with fewer than 500 employees.)

- The U.S. economy was strong in 2011, with real gross domestic product increasing 3.9 percent and private-sector employment increasing 1.6 percent (Bureau of Economic Analysis, Bureau of Labor Statistics).
- The nation's small businesses employed 55.0 million workers in 2010 (Table 1) with most of the employment coming from firms with 20-499 employees.
- The employment situation from 2007-2010 was weak, and small businesses in the United States had a net job loss (Table 2). The national unemployment rate in 2010-2011 decreased by 0.7 percent.
- Most of the country's small businesses are very small as 79.4 percent of all businesses have no employees, and most employers have fewer than 20 employees.
- In 2011, the number of opening establishments was higher than closing establishments, and the net employment change from this turnover was positive (Table 3).
- Self-employment improved over the last decade. Minority self-employment fared the best compared with other demographic groups.
