The Abandoned Infants Assistance Initiative 1988–2017

During the 1980s, there was a rise in the number of infants and young children abandoned in hospitals, specifically infants who were prenatally exposed to drugs and children with acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS). Hospital care for this vulnerable population was extremely costly and deprived children of an appropriately nurturing environment. Thus, Congress enacted the Abandoned Infants Assistance (AIA) Act of 1988, which authorized the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to award grants to public and private entities to, among other things, accomplish the following:

- Prevent the abandonment of infants and young children
- Identify and address the needs of abandoned infants and young children, particularly those with AIDS
- Assist infants and young children, particularly those with AIDS, to reside with their natural families or in foster families, as appropriate
- Recruit, train, and retain foster families
- Carry out residential care programs
- Carry out respite care programs for families and foster families of infants and young children with AIDS
- Recruit and train health and social services personnel to work with such families and residential programs (AIA Act of 1988)

In response to the AIA Act, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Service's Children's Bureau funded 128 demonstration projects between 1988 and 2015. From 2000 to 2015, \$7,660,000 was distributed among the demonstration grants to develop effective services to care for abandoned infants and young children who have been exposed to drugs. The Children's Bureau's AIA initiative continues to influence research related to supporting families and expanding services for children and youth involved in child welfare.

This summary provides a brief history of legislation related to abandoned infants and children and links to AIA cross-site evaluation reports, final reports, and other grantee products.

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Legislative History

The Abandoned Infants Assistance (AIA) Act changed over time to reflect the needs of the target population it served. When the Act was reauthorized in 1991, provisions were added to include demonstration projects for comprehensive service centers, including the creation of the AIA National Resource Center (Mcgowan, 1999; AIA Act Amendments of 1991). The 1991 reauthorization also expanded the provision of services to all members of the child's natural family in order to address risk factors that increase the probability of child abandonment. The focus on family preservation services and mitigating family risk factors was further solidified with the 1996 reauthorization of the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act (CAPTA), which extended the AIA demonstration projects through 2001 (CAPTA Amendments of 1996; Mcgowan, 1999). The AIA work was subsequently included in the 1996 CAPTA reauthorization and extended in the Promoting Safe and Stable Families Amendments of 2001, the Keeping Children and Families Safe Act of 2003, and the CAPTA Reauthorization Act of 2010. As support for AIA funding opportunities continued, the scope of work in the latter part of the 2000s expanded to include additional populations in need, namely children and teenagers with the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV)/ AIDS and those affected by parental substance use.

AIA Demonstration Projects

Over the years, AIA demonstration project grantees have included hospitals, community-based child and family services agencies, universities, and public child welfare agencies. Each demonstration project was specifically tailored to meet the needs of its respective target population, and numerous approaches were implemented throughout the 27 years of the Children's Bureau's initiative. Projects were not focused on developing a one-size-fits-all approach. Therefore, the diversity of programs and interventions implemented across the country can inform strategies for supporting children and families affected by the wide-ranging issue of substance use.

Cross-Site Evaluations

Because AIA demonstration grants tailored services to the specific communities they served, cross-site evaluations are extremely useful in comparing individual grant experiences to create overall lessons learned. National Abandoned Infants Resource Center

The National Abandoned Infants Resource Center received funding from the Children's Bureau from 1991 to 2016. The Resource Center was dedicated to enhancing the quality of social and health services for infants and children who have been abandoned or who are at risk for abandonment and their families, particularly those infants or children with HIV/AIDS. Through the provision of training and technical assistance, the Resource Center worked to develop and coordinate effective service provisions for this population through cross-system collaboration with child welfare and early childhood professionals.

Although the Resource Center is no longer operational, its resources continue to promote the well-being of children who have been abandoned or who are at risk of abandonment.
