## A BILL

To require the Secretary of Transportation to modify provisions relating to hours of service requirements with respect to transportation of certain live animals, and for other purposes.

1        *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2        *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Transporting Livestock  
3 Across America Safely Act”.

4 **SEC. 2. HOURS OF SERVICE REGULATIONS FOR TRANSPOR-**  
5 **TATION OF CERTAIN ANIMALS.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Transportation  
7 shall amend part 395 of title 49, Code of Federal Regula-  
8 tions, to ensure that, in the case of a driver transporting  
9 a covered animal within a 300 air-mile radius from the  
10 point at which the on-duty time of the driver begins with  
11 respect to the trip—

12 (1) the on-duty time of the driver shall exclude  
13 all time spent—

14 (A) at a plant, terminal, facility, or other  
15 property of a motor carrier or shipper or on any  
16 public property during which the driver is wait-  
17 ing to be dispatched;

18 (B) loading or unloading a commercial  
19 motor vehicle;

20 (C) supervising or assisting in the loading  
21 or unloading of a commercial motor vehicle;

22 (D) attending to a commercial motor vehi-  
23 cle while the vehicle is being loaded or un-  
24 loaded;

25 (E) remaining in readiness to operate a  
26 commercial motor vehicle; and

1 (F) giving or receiving receipts for ship-  
2 ments loaded or unloaded;

3 (2) except as provided in paragraph (5), the  
4 driving time under section 395.3(a)(3)(i) of that title  
5 is modified to a maximum of not less than 15, and  
6 not more than 18, hours within a 24-hour period;

7 (3) the driver may take one or more rest peri-  
8 ods during the trip, which shall not be included in  
9 the calculation of the driving time;

10 (4) after completion of the trip, the driver shall  
11 be required to take a rest break for a period that  
12 is 5 hours less than the maximum driving time  
13 under paragraph (2);

14 (5) if the driver is within 150 air-miles of the  
15 point of delivery, the driver may continue for not  
16 more than 2 additional hours, which shall not be in-  
17 cluded in the calculation of the driving time; and

18 (6) the 10-hour rest period under section  
19 395.3(a)(1) of that title shall not apply.

20 (b) COVERED ANIMAL.—In this Act, the term “cov-  
21 ered animal” means a live animal that is one of the fol-  
22 lowing:

23 (1) Livestock (as defined in section 602 of the  
24 Agricultural Act of 1949 (7 U.S.C. 1471)).

25 (2) Honey bees.
