A BILL

To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to provide that any alien who has been convicted of a felony or two misdemeanors, is deportable, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Criminal Alien Re-
5 moval Clarification Act of 2018”.

1 **SEC. 2. CRIMINAL GROUNDS FOR DEPORTABILITY.**

2 Section 237(a)(2) of the Immigration and Nationality
3 Act (8 U.S.C. 1227(a)(2)) is amended to read as follows:

4 “(2) CRIMINAL GROUNDS.—Any alien who, at
5 any time after admission, has been convicted of a
6 felony or two misdemeanors, whether under State or
7 Federal law, is deportable.”.

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
