## AN ACT

To prohibit the Secretary of Transportation from granting authority to a motor carrier domiciled in Mexico to operate beyond United States municipalities and commercial zones on the United States-Mexico border unless expressly authorized by Congress.

LIMITATION ON LONG-HAUL CROSS BORDER 2 MOTOR CARRIER OPERATIONS. 3 (a) TERMINATION OF PILOT PROGRAM.—Not later than September 6, 2008, the Secretary of Transportation 4 5 shall terminate the one-year cross border demonstration project the Secretary started on September 6, 2007, as 7 described in the Federal Register notices dated May 1, 8 2007 (72 Fed. Reg. 23883), June 8, 2007 (72 Fed. Reg. 9 31877), and August 17, 2007 (72 Fed. Reg. 46263). 10 (b) Congressional Authorization Required.— 11 Unless expressly authorized by Congress, the Secretary may not grant authority to a motor carrier domiciled in 13 Mexico to operate beyond United States municipalities and commercial zones on the United States-Mexico border after September 6, 2008. 15 SEC. 2. 23	the number of vehicles each motor carrier uti-

- 1 (B) the number of border crossings by 2 motor carriers participating in the demonstra-3 tion project, including the number of crossings which resulted in a motor carrier traveling beyond United States municipalities and commer-6 cial zones on the United States-Mexico border; 7 (C) an itemization of safety and oper-8 ational violations identified among motor car-9 riers participating in the demonstration project 10 in pre-authorization safety audits, compliance 11 reviews, and roadside inspections, including a 12 review of the most frequent types of violations; 13 (D) an analysis of the cost to the Federal 14 Government and State partners of imple-15 menting the demonstration project, including 16 administrative costs, safety monitoring and en-17 forcement costs, and the cost of installing glob-18 al positioning system units on participating ve-19 hicles; and 20 21 22
  - (E) measures taken by the Secretary to terminate the authority of motor carriers participating in the demonstration project to operate beyond United States municipalities and commercial zones on the United States-Mexico border after September 6, 2008, and ensure

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- 1 that such motor carriers cease long-haul oper-
- 2 ations.
