AN ACT

- To amend the Pittman-Robertson Wildlife Restoration Act to modernize the funding of wildlife conservation, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Modernizing the Pitt-3 man-Robertson Fund for Tomorrow's Needs Act".

4 SEC. 2. PURPOSE.

5 The first section of the Pittman-Robertson Wildlife 6 Restoration Act (16 U.S.C. 669) is amended by adding 7 at the end the following: "One of the purposes of this Act 8 is to provide financial and technical assistance to the 9 States for the promotion of hunting and recreational 10 shooting.".

11 SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.

Section 2 of the Pittman-Robertson Wildlife Restoration Act (16 U.S.C. 669a) is amended—

(1) by redesignating paragraphs (2) through
(8) as paragraphs (4) through (10), respectively;
and

17 (2) by inserting after paragraph (1) the fol-18 lowing:

19 "(2) for the purposes of determining the num20 ber of paid hunting-license holders in a State, the
21 term 'fiscal year' means the fiscal year or license
22 year of the State;

23 "(3) the term 'hunter recruitment and rec24 reational shooter recruitment' means any activity or
25 project to recruit or retain hunters and recreational
26 shooters, including by—

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1	"(A) using social media, marketing, adver-
2	tising, surveying, television spots, print, and
3	media;
4	"(B) providing education, mentoring, and
5	field demonstrations;
6	"(C) enhancing access for hunting and rec-
7	reational shooting, including through range con-
8	struction;
9	"(D) providing education to the public
10	about the role of hunting and recreational
11	shooting in funding wildlife conservation; and
12	"(E) using any other means to ensure the
13	growth of hunting and recreational shooting, as
14	determined by the Secretary;".
15	SEC. 4. ALLOCATION AND APPORTIONMENT OF AVAILABLE
16	AMOUNTS.
17	(a) Apportionment to States.—Section 4(b) of
18	the Pittman-Robertson Wildlife Restoration Act (16
19	U.S.C. 669c(b)) is amended—
20	(1) in the first sentence, by striking "The Sec-
21	retary of the Interior" and inserting the following:
22	"(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary";
23	(2) in the second sentence, by striking "Such
24	apportionments" and inserting the following:

1	"(2) ADJUSTMENTS.—The apportionments
2	under paragraph (1)";
3	(3) by striking the third sentence; and
4	(4) by adding at the end the following:
5	"(3) Use of funds.—
6	"(A) IN GENERAL.—Subject to subpara-
7	graph (B), amounts apportioned under this
8	subsection may be used for hunter recruitment
9	and recreational shooter recruitment.
10	"(B) LIMITATION.—A State may make an
11	expenditure under subparagraph (A) only if the
12	amount of the expenditure during the fiscal
13	year in which the expenditure is made plus the
14	amount of the expenditures for hunter recruit-
15	ment and recreational shooter recruitment
16	made during the 4 fiscal years preceding that
17	fiscal year is not greater than 25 percent of the
18	total amount apportioned to the State under
19	this subsection during that 5-fiscal-year pe-
20	riod.".

9	Section 8 of the Pittman-Robertson Wildlife Restora-
10	tion Act (16 U.S.C. 669g) is amended—
11	(1) in subsection (a), in the third sentence, by
12	striking "and public relations"; and
13	(2) in subsection (b), in the first sentence, by
14	striking ", as a part of such program".
15	SEC. 6. FIREARM AND BOW HUNTER EDUCATION AND SAFE-
16	TY PROGRAM GRANTS.
17	Section $10(a)(1)(A)$ of the Pittman-Robertson Wild-
18	life Restoration Act $(16$ U.S.C. $669h-1(a)(1)(A))$ is
19	amended—
20	(1) in clause (iii), by striking "and" at the end;
21	and
22	(2) by adding at the end the following:
23	"(v) the enhancement of hunter re-
24	cruitment and recreational shooter recruit-
25	ment; and".

1	SEC. 7. MULTISTATE CONSERVATION GRANT PROGRAM.
2	Section 11 of the Pittman-Robertson Wildlife Res-
3	toration Act (16 U.S.C. 669h–2) is amended—
4	(1) in subsection $(a)(1)$ —
5	(A) by striking "Not more than" and in-
6	serting the following:
7	"(A) IN GENERAL.—Not more than"; and
8	(B) by adding at the end the following:
9	"(B) AVAILABILITY FOR HUNTER AND
10	RECREATIONAL SHOOTER GRANTS.—Not more
11	than $$5,000,000$ of the revenues covered into
12	the fund from any tax imposed under section
13	4161(b) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986
14	for a fiscal year shall be available to the Sec-
15	retary exclusively for making hunter recruit-
16	ment and recreational shooter recruitment
17	grants that promote a national hunting and
18	shooting sport recruitment program, including
19	related communication and outreach activi-
20	ties.";
