A BILL

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Protect Access to Birth
5 Control Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. REPEAL.**

7 The rules issued by the Department of the Treasury,
8 Department of Labor, and Department of Health and
9 Human Services entitled “Religious Exemptions and Ac-
10 commodations for Coverage of Certain Preventive Services
11 Under the Affordable Care Act” (82 Fed. Reg. 47792 (Oc-
12 tober 13, 2017)) and “Moral Exemptions and Accom-
13 modations for Coverage of Certain Preventive Services
14 Under the Affordable Care Act” (82 Fed. Reg. 47838 (Oc-
15 tober 13, 2017)) shall have no force or effect, and shall
16 be treated as though such rules had never taken effect.
