

Eligibility

Nominees to the service academies must be United States citizens, and applicants to Congressman Roe's office must be permanent residents of Tennessee's 1st District. Candidates must be 17 but not yet 23 years of age by July 1 of the year of admission. Candidates must be unmarried, not pregnant, and have no legal obligation to support any dependents. These stipulations have been established by the service academies.

Prior to applying for a nomination, each candidate must contact the academies directly to request a Pre-Candidate Questionnaire. Upon the completion and return of this form to the academy, you will be informed of academy requirements, such as medical examinations and physical aptitude tests. It is also recommended that each candidate attempt to visit the academies to meet with admissions representatives, talk to cadets, and view the facilities.

Department of Defense Medical Examination Review Board

All academies require you to pass a Department of Defense Medical Examination Review Board (DODMERB). Candidates who meet the minimum scholastic standards will be scheduled to take a service academy qualifying medical examination. The academy to which you have applied will initiate the scheduling of the examination, and once taken, the results may be used for all service academies. Medical scheduling and evaluation are time-consuming processes, especially if consultation, retesting, or corrective action is required. The process may take from six weeks to four months.

Method of nomination

The law pertaining to congressional nominations stipulates that each Member of Congress is allowed a maximum of five "charges" at each academy in any given year (Merchant Marine is an exception). When a "charge" graduates, a vacancy is created that the Member may fill.

Due to the competitiveness of the selection process, it is strongly recommended that each candidate apply to their U.S. Senators, U.S. Representative, and the Vice President.

Additional information

Congressional nomination does not guarantee acceptance to the service academies, but only assures that your application will be considered first by the review boards. Your application to each academy that you are considering should be completed before or during the first semester of your senior year.

Academically, the majority of students accepted to the academies are in at least the top twenty percent of their class, with higher than average test scores. Most students who receive appointment offers are active at school and in their community and hold leadership roles in sports and other extracurricular activities.

Acceptance of an appointment from an academy obligates you to at least a nine-year commitment, four years at the academy followed by five years of active duty service.

Instructions for Candidates Seeking Nominations to Service Academies

An individual seeking nomination to one of the service academies from Congressman Phil Roe, First Congressional District of Tennessee, is encouraged to apply in the spring of his/her junior year. Only students entering an academy in the summer following their graduation from high school may apply for a nomination during their senior year. Submit the following information to:

- 1. **Completed** "Application for Nomination to United States Service Academies".
- 2. **Official** certified copy of SAT or ACT scores.
- 3. **Official** high school transcript (sent by your guidance office) and college transcript (if applicable).
- 4. **Resume of extracurricular activities:** It is very important to be thorough and include all information for each year in high school. Include both school related and outside activities (note leadership positions held), athletic activities (note varsity letters earned and leadership positions held), scholastic honors, and any part-time or full-time jobs you have held since you have been in high school.
- 5. **Recent wallet size** photograph.
- 6. **Essay** stating what motivates you to attend a Unites States Service Academy (one typed page is sufficient)
- 7. **Three** letters of recommendation.

Candidate: Please give a copy of this sheet to the three people who agree to write a letter of recommendation for you.

Recommender: This student has expressed a desire to attend a United States Service Academy (the Military Academy at West Point, the Naval Academy at Annapolis, the Air Force Academy, or the Merchant Marine Academy). Admission to these academies is extremely limited and competitive, and an appointment is an esteemed honor and achievement. After successfully completing a rigorous four-year program in one of these competitive schools and receiving a first-rate education, a successful graduate will be pledged to serve a term as an officer in our armed forces.

In order to apply to a service academy, an applicant must obtain a nomination from an authorized source, and this applicant has requested a nomination from Congressman Phil Roe, a Representative of the First District of Tennessee. Congressman Roe and his Academy Selection Committee would appreciate your thorough and honest evaluation of the applicant's fitness for U.S. Service Academy admission and ensuing military career.
