Transitional sheltering assistance is available to residents of Puerto Rico that have relocated due to effects of Hurricanes Irma and Maria. Survivors should register with FEMA at www.disasterassistance.gov or by calling 1-800-621-3362 in order to determine eligibility for this assistance.

The Assisted Housing Department administers the Housing Choice Voucher Program, which is federal rent subsidy that assists low-income households with monthly rental payments. BLUE ROOF & TARPS
Temporary roof repairs.



TU HOGAR RENACE
Temporary repair and essential power to enable survivors to shelter at home.



TRANSITIONAL SHELTERING ASSISTANCE (TSA)
Temporary hotel room with limited transportation for survivors.



DIRECT LEASE AND MULTI-FAMILY LEASE AND REPAIR
Leasing of rental properties to survivors.



VOLUNTARY AGENCIES
Volunteers can provide emotional and spiritual care, repair and rebuild homes, and perform other much-needed disaster work.

Financial Assistance



INSURANCE
Some insurance coverage will provide money toward additional living expenses.



RENTAL ASSISTANCE
Housing funds to temporarily rent another dwelling while repairs are made to your pre-disaster primary residence.



MORTGAGE ASSISTANCE
HUD and USDA offer low interest mortgage loans to disaster survivors toward the purchase of a home.



LOW-INTEREST DISASTER LOANS
SBA offers low-interest disaster loans to homeowners, renters and businesses of all sizes.



FINANCIAL REPAIR
Provides grant money to cover necessary repairs to make a home safe, habitable and functional.



PERSONAL PROPERTY
The Other Needs Assistance program may pay for repair and replacement of: household items, medical, dental, funeral, and miscellaneous items.
