

# NATIONAL SECURITY APPROPRIATIONS LEGISLATION

## **DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE — \$658.1B**

- Boosts base funding for the Department of Defense by \$68.1B (13% above FY17 enacted levels) to continue rebuilding our military
- Includes \$73.9B in Overseas Contingency Operations funding to ensure our troops have the training and equipment needed to maintain our military superiority
- Fully funds the authorized 2.4% pay raise—the largest military pay increase in 8 years
- Keeps our military on the cutting edge of defense technology by investing \$84.3B in research and development (\$11.6B above FY17) and \$149.9B in equipment and weapons procurement (\$31.2B above FY17)

### **MILITARY CONSTRUCTION & VETERANS AFFAIRS — \$88.8B**

- Provides the highest level of funding ever for the Department of Veterans Affairs—\$78.3B, an increase of \$3.9B (5%) above FY17
  - ♦ Supports medical care for 7M VA patients, including mental health care services, suicide prevention activities, traumatic brain injury treatment, opioid abuse prevention, and homeless veterans services
- **Helps rebuild our Armed Forces,** increasing funding by **25**% for the construction of critical military infrastructure that keeps our troops prepared and healthy (\$10.2B total)

#### **ENERGY & WATER DEVELOPMENT — \$37.6B**

- **Strengthens national security** by increasing funding for the Department of Energy's nuclear weapons programs by **\$976M** above FY17 (**\$13.9B** total)
- Improves public safety, creates jobs, and grows our economy through \$6.16B in funding for the Army Corps of Engineers, prioritizing navigation projects and studies and flood and storm damage reduction
- Moves the U.S. toward energy independence—investing in Department of Energy programs that reduce our reliance on foreign oil, keep down energy costs, and make greater use of our natural energy resources
- Reduces regulatory red tape, including authorizing the Administrator of the EPA and the Secretary of the Army to withdraw from the Waters of the U.S. rule

## **LEGISLATIVE BRANCH — \$3.58B**

- Prioritizes the security of Members, their staffs, and the people they serve
  - ♦ Supports projects related to district security and boosts funding for the Capitol Police for enhanced training, equipment, and technology
- Maintains critical functions of the House of Representatives to ensure Members of Congress can continue representing the American people in the Legislative Branch
  - ♦ Continues the pay freeze for Members of Congress

## PHYSICAL BARRIER CONSTRUCTION — \$1.6B

• **Provides \$1.6B to secure our Southern border,** including bollards and levee improvements, meeting the full White House request
