#### SUBALLOCATION OF BUDGET ALLOCATIONS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2019

The Committee on Appropriations submits the following report on the suballocation of budget allocations for fiscal year 2019. The 302(b) suballocations and resulting total 302(a) meet the levels prescribed by the Bipartisan Budget Act of 2018.

Pursuant to section 30104 of the Bipartisan Budget Act of 2018, the House Budget Committee submitted an allocation for fiscal year 2019 for the Committee on Appropriations. The funding levels submitted in this Committee report meet the levels stipulated for the Committee on Appropriations by the Budget Committee in its submission printed in the Congressional Record of May 10, 2018. Further, submission of this report meets the requirement of section 302(b) of the Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 and resulting requirement under the Rules of the House. The Committee is moving expeditiously and has thus far reported seven fiscal year 2019 appropriation bills to the House for consideration.
