\$54B In both regular discretionary and Overseas Contingency Operations funding (\$3.4B below FY17) to support U.S. foreign policy and national security priorities

ADVANCING U.S. INTERESTS TO PROMOTE NATIONAL SECURITY

- Targets State Department funding (**\$16B** in base and OCO funding) to **diplomatic efforts to enhance peace and stability around the globe**
 - **Bolsters embassy security** by providing **\$6B** for facility upgrades and security personnel as recommended by the Benghazi Accountability Review Board
- **Strengthens the nation's security** by providing **\$9B** in base and OCO funding for international security assistance, including:
 - \$345M for antiterrorism programs that assist in the fight to defeat ISIS and other terrorist groups
 - **\$250M** for the Countering Russian Influence Fund authorized by Congress
 - **\$28M** for programs to implement the President's Executive Order on Transnational Criminal Organizations and Preventing International Trafficking
 - **\$500M** for stabilization assistance for areas liberated from or at risk of influence by ISIS and other terrorist organizations in the Middle East and Africa
- Provides **\$11B** in total Overseas Contingency Operations (OCO) funding to **support operations, stabilization assistance, and humanitarian relief in areas of conflict and instability, such as Iraq and Afghanistan**

ASSERTING U.S. LEADERSHIP AND INFLUENCE

- Fully funds the **\$3.1B** U.S.-Israel Memorandum of Understanding
- **Provides security assistance for key allies and partners** like Ukraine, Georgia, Egypt, Jordan, Morocco, and Tunisia
- Maintains funding for humanitarian assistance to respond to unprecedented global displacements and emergencies and for programs to improve global health and combat infectious diseases
- **Fosters opportunities to advance U.S. economic interests** by supporting public-private development partnerships to increase market access and by preserving U.S. influence in multilateral development banks

ENSURING RESPONSIBLE AND EFFECTIVE USE OF TAX DOLLARS

- Includes reforms and reductions in payments to the UN and other international organizations, including: no funds to implement the UN Arms Trade Treaty; no funding for the UN Human Rights Council unless the Secretary determines it is national interest and the Council stops its anti-Israel Agenda; and withholding funds for UN organizations headed by countries that support terrorism or if the Secretary of State determines an agency acts against U.S. interests
- Maintains accountability to the U.S. taxpayer by funding Inspectors General at or above FY17 levels, strengthening requirements to implement State Department management reforms, and continuing the prohibition on use of private networks and servers for official government business
- Prohibits funds for the Green Climate Fund
- Maintains all prior-year pro-life funding restrictions, including Kemp-Kasten, Tiahrt, and Helms amendments, and rejects attempts to roll back the President's expanded Mexico City policy
